- Truckee and North Tahoe Baseball need to use some of our fields due to our tough winter. In the interest of good sportsmanship, we will work to get them some space.
 - Norman Maxwell will help with scheduling Truckee and NT.

Fields Report 6.0

As per our agreement with the City of Reno we are required to provide an annual report of the condition of RYSA and the fields.

We stared the new impact fee this year. High impact members were assessed \$3.50 per player per season, medium impact will paid \$2.00 and low impact will not see an increase in overall fees. This year we increased fertilization and aeration at the following parks, Plumas, Terrace, Jamaica/Pine, Hilltop, Terrace, Grace Warner, Echo Loder and Miguel Rivera. Additional parks will be added in 2017

Terrace Park and Plumas continue to have problems dog feces. The main problem is the apartment dwellers at Gojack. We will continue to work with the city for a viable solution.

Aeration by RYSA;

As mentioned before, the City of Reno Parks and Recreation department is the only entity that does not aerate fields, Washoe County, City of Sparks, Carson City, South Lake Tahoe, Incline Village and Truckee does their own aeration. If the city took over that function we could use the \$110,000 to rehabilitate fields and within 3 years 75% of the field would be classified as "A".

Aeration for 2016 Spring-Precision Turf Management-\$43,750 Spring-Western Turf-\$17,356

Fall-Precision Turf Management-\$33,150 Fall-Western Turf-\$13,998 Total aeration for 2016-\$110,254

Both entities have agreed to charge the same for 2017.

Moana Springs Flat Fields

This complex remains a strong economic component to the local restaurants. GBYSL pays all mowing, maintenance and fertilization of the the fields, approximately \$21,000 for 2016. The fields are used Monday through Friday as practice field and on Saturday they host 69 games. 69 games represent 138 teams, using an average of 8 players per team that is 1,100 players. Since they are younger teams often parents, sibling and

relatives watch the game. We estimate there 4,500 people on the fields throughout the day.

GBYSL has an agreement with City of Reno and this park is no longer under RYSA. Reno1868FC will use the field for practice in exchange for approximately \$12,000 of maintenance and upgrades. This month they will place 90 tons of sand to level the field and enhance the turf. Their field manager of Greater Nevada Fields will work directly with Cal from Precision Turf Maintenance.

Overuse of fields

Youth sports participation continues to increase to the point of overuse. I estimate the tier A/B fields are used 145% of capacity, C fields are being used however many of them are in need of major sod repair. Taylor Park on Wells Avenue is roughly 50% dirt and unplayable in its present condition. We are seeing a large increase in lacrosse in our area.

Lacrosse has increased from 1 to 3 clubs in our area. Baseball is reporting increase in overall numbers. There is a big increase in "travel baseball" teams on our area. We are now requiring them to become members in RYSA and go through the same permitting process as all other members. We feel this will give us a better idea on overall numbers and help with raising funds for field maintenance and development.

With the influx of new businesses coming to Northern Nevada we can anticipate 56,000 new jobs. The increase in overall families with kids will be tremendous. We have to start planning now.

Future Recreational Tournaments

In an article Chris Baum, Northern Nevada Business weekly, stated;

Reno-Sparks Convention and Visitors Authority has a "secret weapon." Forty percent of the RSCVA's business comes from sporting events, says Chris Baum, president and chief executive officer at RSCVA. The average convention books 2,500 room nights. Sporting events are bigger, he says, and "grows year after year." "People think that everybody gets these big conventions. They don't. We're unique," Baum says. Sports enthusiasts, because of their dedication, also make great customers. "So much of selling is credibility and delivering on promises," Baum says. "We get a lot of referrals." He gives much of the credit of securing these events to Shelli Fine with the RSACA.

We have talked in the past about the inability to host large tournaments in our area due to lack of larger facilities. There is a new tournament in June, the Northern Nevada Mayors Cup. The plan is to build this into a high quality college showcase tournament. Las Vegas hosts three (3) similar tournaments. The largest is the Players Showcase Tournament, over 800 teams participate over a two weekend period, and the economic

impact is staggering. This year the tournament had to turn away 200 teams due to lack of fields.

Total Economic Impact for the Memorial Day B Ball Tourney in 2014 at 1,100 teams - \$8,108,803. Estimated (conservative) Number of Room Nights Generated - 22,000 TRN Gaming Impact - \$1,449,576

Clark County has 8 venues with 10 or more fields and 9 venues with 5 or more fields. Washoe County's largest field complex is South Valleys Complex with 4 large fields. North Valleys Complex should be adding 1 new field in 2017 for a total of 4 fields. Clark County has just started construction on a new 16 field complex in Southern Vegas and a new 18 field complex in Henderson.

Possible new projects in the area;

South Valleys Recreational Complex-The Greater Reno Community Ice Skating Association has been working with Washoe County in the development of a two (2) sheet ice rink. The Washoe County Commissioner approved the new Master Plan for South Valleys.

We understand this project is in the extreme early planning stages.

Off to rest fields and use by neighbors, flag football often seen on field as well as lacrosse and rugby.

RYSA fees

\$10 per player per season

OLS if we used same scenario \$288@\$10=\$2880 per season or \$5760 per year

Recommendation;

OLS pays the same fees as other user groups; this money will be diverted to RYSA as they pay for aeration, fertilizer and general sprinkler maintenance. RYSA just allocated \$1,500 for aeration only and \$800 for simple sod repairs, waiting for report on sprinkler heads and fertilizer.

Going forward for future upgrades to sod and sprinklers;

1-Lower, split evenly with RYSA/City of Reno Parks and Recreation/GBYSL 2-Upper fields, split evenly with RYSA/COR/GBYSL/Our Lady of the Snows

Other recommendations

New signage as to no dogs during games and or practices, make them larger than existing signs, GBYSL/RYSA will assist in paying for new signs

Remove large baseball backstop fences on fields, they were designed to keep balls from going into street, does not make sense and the fields are configured in opposite as to the fences. This will allow for additional space.

Richard Jay, our NYSA commissioner asked me to send you information regarding championship tournament in Northern Nevada. I have the information he requested regarding hosting regional and or national tournaments for US Youth Soccer.

US Youth Soccer requires any venue to have a minimum of 16 full sized fields, full sized is considered 115 yards by 75 yards. In addition to the field they recommend the following;

Natural grass or artificial turf Well defined location, near freeway exits and major hotels Adequate restroom facilities Close to restaurants Adequate parking Bleachers are not required Designated area for presentation of awards Airport supported by the major carriers Based on what you have described regarding Pembroke, I think this could be perfect for hosting championship type tournaments; most notably regional Presidents Cup and the National Championships. The freeway access from the southeast corridor would be ideal and utilizing natural grass only enhances the level of play.

The climate would be perfect for hosting the games. In addition, the recreation tourism offers a lot to the families; Lake Tahoe, Virginia City and other such amenities.

I understand you have several hotels that are interested in sponsoring the events with discounted rates and other perks for the visitors. This will help strengthen your bid for the tournaments.

I would also like to mention your ability to host college showcase tournaments. As you are aware of the Mayors Cup College Showcase Tournament in Las Vegas; over 800 teams travel to Las Vegas over two weekends to participate in these events. The economic impact is over \$20 million to the local economy in Las Vegas. Reno could build a great college showcase tournament and help to boost the local tourism.

Nevada Youth Soccer Association would like to offer our assistance in the development of this exciting complex.
